Hutton Hill Road Closure Update

At the time of writing, the Parish Council has requested and received two updates regarding the Hutton Hill road closure – one from the property owner of 1 Barrow Road and one from North Somerset Council. Both are summarized below:

Update from the property owner of 1 Barrow Road - a Contractor has been appointed and it is hoped that North Somerset Council will approve the plans for the rebuilding of the collapsed wall early in February. **Phase 1** will be the securing of the bank of earth. **Phase 2** will be the building of the new wall in the drier spring months.

Update from North Somerset Council (Highways) via our District Councillors (Cllrs Terry Porter and Mike Solomon) - North Somerset Council Building Control have been working with the residents. A structural engineer has been appointed by the insurance company and they are preparing retaining wall reconstruction designs and structural calculations which need to be approved by the council structures team. North Somerset Council have also been advised that a planning application regarding the retaining wall reconstruction will be submitted week commencing 3rd Feb. A builder has been appointed to carry out **phase one** of the remedial works which consist of removing unstable sections of the remaining retaining wall and to provide temporary support. North Somerset Council Building Control have advised that **phase one** could be achieved in about 4 weeks. Once **phase one** is completed North Somerset Council will reassess the situation but assume the road will need to remain closed to allow the retaining wall permanent reconstruction and minimise vibrations in the area until it is completely safe.

Hutton Parish Council would like to thank both the property owner of 1 Barrow Road and North Somerset Council for their updates, copies of which will also be published and be made available on the Parish Council Web Site and Facebook page.

As a cost saving and efficiency measure, it was agreed at the Parish Council Meeting in December to permanently close the Hutton Parish Council Office in Hutton Village Hall by no later than the 31st March 2025.

<u>Future Parish Clerk Surgery in Hutton Village Hall - Wednesday - "Mustard Seed" Fair Trade Coffee Shop</u>

Following the closure of the Parish Council Office in Hutton Village Hall at the end of March, it has been agreed that commencing in April, the Parish Clerk will attend the Wednesday - "Mustard Seed" Fair Trade Coffee Shop in Hutton Village Hall on the **first and third Wednesday in the month** and will be available as a Parish Clerk Surgery.

Therefore, the dates of the Parish Clerk Surgery for **April will be the 2nd and 16th**.

Further dates of future Parish Clerk Surgeries will be detailed in future editions of the Hutton Parish News, Parish Council Website, Facebook and Notice Board (when available).

CO-OPTION TO THE PARISH COUNCIL

Hutton Parish Council still has **three vacancies** and the Council is proposing again to take steps to fill the vacancies by the co-option of suitable persons. Hence any eligible interested persons are invited to apply for co-option to the Parish Council as a Councillor.

<u>Eligibility</u> To be able to stand as a Parish Councillor, an applicant must:

- be at least 18 years old on the day of nomination
- be a British citizen, or an eligible Commonwealth citizen
- meet at least one of the following four qualifications:
 - 1. He/she is an elector for the parish; or
 - 2. has resided in the parish for the past twelve months or rented/tenanted land in the parish; or
 - 3. had his/her principal place of work in the parish; or
 - 4. has lived within three miles (straight line) of the parish.

There are certain disqualifications for election, shown below. (See section 5.80 of the Local Government Act 1972 for a full list of disqualification criteria)

- holding a paid office of the Parish Council
- bankruptcy.
- having been sentenced to a term of imprisonment (whether suspended or not) of not less than three months, without the option of a fine during the five years preceding the election; and
- being disqualified under any enactment relating to corrupt or illegal practices.



Here are the works we were able to undertake whilst in Dabaso:

The Clinic

- ☐ Clinic painted inside and out
- \square £500 medication purchased
- ☐ Clinic toilet and water supply mended
- ☐ Meetings with and visit from Kalifi Health Authority in the hope of receiving govt funding. They may set up a dispensary and part time maternity service nearby.
- \square Two doctors from the Twinning committee lead clinics.
- ☐ Donations of clothes, flip flops, soap and a human body teaching model.



The Twinning Association were delighted to be able to deliver football kits, donated by Hutton Football Club, on the visit.





The School

We loved being able to share letters written by the Children of Hutton CE Primary school and on returning have delivered letters written by the children of Dabaso. It is so valuable to learning and understanding to have links between young people of both villages.



Here are the works we were able to undertake in the school

- ☐ Electric cables and double sockets to three new classrooms.
- ☐ Windows and doors security for three new classrooms.
- ☐ Staff and student toilets improved with water supply and cisterns.
- \square Head teacher supplied with laptop.
- ☐ Floor improved and space created next to library for overspill reading activities.
- \square Damaged roof section mended.
- ☐ Teacher meetings.
- ☐ Letter writing, reading and parachute games activities.





All this made possible from the kind donations, fundraising and ongoing support at events in Hutton throughout the year. The people of Dabaso are very grateful.

As I'm sure we are aware men's mental health is very much a subject that is being talked about more openly now days which can only be a good thing. What's often found is men don't talk about things that bother them and equally important there are little opportunities to talk if they wish too.

Before Christmas there was a proposal to start men's club in Hutton to provide the space for men to share like-minded interests and peer support as required.

The inaugural meeting was held in December which was very well attended. As a group we discussed what people wanted and how to meet those needs. The proposal wasn't to establish a men's shed facility which are already available locally instead a regular location where men can meet.

Funding was discussed at length to cover cost and since that meeting, I'm please to advise that Weston-super-Mare Lions Club have kindly provided start-up funds to cover the first 3 months hall hire cost to help the group establish itself.

From that meeting it was decided by the group that we hold by-monthly meetings in Hutton Village Hall with each visitor contributing £3 per visit towards the cost of tea, coffee, biscuits and hall hire. All ages of men 18+ are welcome to attend and first-time visitors pay nothing.

On 9th January we held the first full session that like before was very well supported where everyone enjoyed playing either cards, dominos, shove halfpenny, read the papers supplied or just talked while tea and coffees flowed. The feedback received after the afternoon has been very positive and I would like to thank Hutton Village Hall for their support and help in this endeavour.



Want to know more about this knitting group and the amazing things they do?

The knitting group was started in the late 1950s/early 60s with an entirely different (and large) team of people based at Weston General Hospital. In 2005 we held a dinner at Batch Farm where it was announced that the group had raised more than £1 million pounds over the years and the Knit In has been a big fundraiser for at least the last 45 years - but we always need more knitters. You certainly don't have to be an expert.

Unfortunately, the group has become smaller (and older!!!) and now our fundraising is down to the Knit In, bucket collections at the local supermarkets and collecting goblets in shops etc. (which last year brought in over £4,000). We also hold raffles at the Taste of Somerset and Weston General Hospital amongst others and we are very grateful for the annual donation of £1,000 from the Rotary Golf Day and the last two years of two large and generous donations from the Wessex Masonic Lodge.

Our group now only numbers five and we really need some fresh blood! We hold an informal get together (or committee meeting!!) every two months and this year have raised nearly £20,000. As we have a "MyProject" account within the CRUK accounts, we are able to direct the funding as locally as possible. We support any clinical trials being held at Weston General or research at Bristol.
