John provided decades of voluntary service to the Parish of Hutton, which included, helping to bring the Taste of Somerset events, the Des Phippen Park and Springwood Adventure Play Area to the Parish of Hutton.

John will be fondly missed and remembered. I personally feel very privileged to have worked with John on the Parish Council for 8 years. **Thank you, John, for all you did** for the Parish of Hutton.

### **Hutton Hill Closure Update**

The Parish Council is extremely aware of the problems and issues that have been caused by the long running **Hutton Hill Road closure** and the further problems cause by the diversion via **Moor Lane, Holm Road and Vereland Road.** The Parish Council, working with and supported by our two District Councillors Terry Porter and Mike Solomon has been pushing North Somerset Council for improvement to the diversion, signage and updates and a solution to the Hutton Hill closure.

Improved diversion signage has now appeared and the information that the Parish Council has received via our two District Councillors. is that to expedite a resolution to the closure, bearing in mind the impact this is having on local residents, representatives from North Somerset Council will be contacting the two affected property owners as soon as possible. If North Somerset Council find that repairs are unable to be completed (either temporary or permanent) within a reasonable timeframe, North Somerset Council will consider their options and what appropriate action can be taken.

As this edition goes to print, the latest information received on the 2<sup>nd</sup> May 24 is that a representative from North Somerset Council has visited the site and that North Somerset Council will now consider their options as soon as possible.

### Woodside Development - Planning Application - 24/P/0142/OUT - Update

The Parish Council received a request from North Somerset Council to comment on an outline planning application (24/P/0142/OUT) for the erection of 48 dwellings, public open space, engineering works, associated infrastructure and ancillary works on the Land to East of Lynx Crescent Hutton Weston-super-Mare.

It was observed that although the actual site location was in Weston-super-Mare, the access will be via Woodside Avenue, Hutton. The Parish Council agreed in principle to **object to the application** on access grounds, previous years of construction work suffered by the Woodside residents and loss of green space.

The Parish Council is awaiting further information from our two District Councillors Terry Porter and Mike Solomon after they have discussed the application with the relevant North Somerset Council Planning Engineer. The application will then be discussed again at the Parish Council Meeting in May, where the next steps will be decided, including any further updates to North Somerset Council regarding the **Parish Council's objection to the planning application.**

### **Elmhurst Play Area Refurbishment**

The work to complete phase 3 of the Elmhurst Play Area refurbishment has now been agreed by the Parish Council with the instruction to proceed now passed to contractor. the current target date for the start of installation is currently 24th June 2024.


We hold our annual junior football tournament on the 1st and 2nd of June this year.

New initiative helps community groups in North Somerset provide local people with expert energy advice.

Calling all community groups in North Somerset! A new project run by the <u>Centre for Sustainable Energy</u> (CSE) is offering community groups funding and support to promote retrofit among local homeowners.

Retrofit means any work to improve the energy efficiency of a home. From insulation to low-carbon technologies like solar panels, retrofit describes any changes made to a home to make it cheaper to heat and more environmentally friendly. Household energy use makes up about 15% of the UK's carbon emissions, so retrofitting homes is vital in our journey to net zero.

The Local Energy Advice Demonstrator (LEAD) project is one of 36 government-funded pilot schemes to overcome barriers to retrofit by providing in-person energy advice. The project aims to reach people who are unlikely to have thought about retrofitting their homes before, and people living in homes that might be seen as difficult to make energy-efficient — like listed buildings or park homes.

CSE is leading the project in North Somerset, sharing their expertise and experience in retrofit, energy efficiency advice and home surveys. CSE is a Bristol-based energy charity that work to tackle the issues of climate change and fuel poverty. Their award-winning retrofit team have over 40 years' experience delivering energy-efficiency improvements in homes across the Southwest.

CSE will be working with local groups to host Open Homes events. These are where local people open their homes to the public, to look at retrofit work they've done on their home. It can be anything from draught-proofing to renewable energy installations like heat pumps or solar panels. Real-life examples offer a first-hand look at what can be achieved and give people the opportunity to talk to the homeowner about their retrofit journey. Experienced retrofit assessors from CSE will also be on hand to provide expert advice.

Bridget Newbury, Senior Project Manager at CSE said: "I've attended events and opened my own house in the past and I think Open Homes events are a great way to inspire more people to improve the energy efficiency of their homes. They're a very accessible and fun way to create a buzz around going green. You can find out first-hand about what's involved in improving a home with no pressure or sales pitch. We've run hundreds of events and we know that event visitors really do go away and start to make changes."

CSE is looking for local community groups to help host Open Homes events. They will provide advice and support throughout the project, as well as tailored resources and grants of up to £5k.
